DemocracyCo have completed the recruitment process and panel members have now been appointed with sessions to be conducted throughout November. CFS Training & Site Preparation

In November, in conjunction with the Country Fire Service, crews from the surrounding areas will be participating in our annual site familiarisation and training session.

During this visit, CFS management and volunteers meet with a range of Neutrog personnel and are provided with a thorough site run through, review of our Fire Management Plan, on-site fire-fighting equipment along with detailed information about how to manage any event that may arise.

In addition, we have been working with the Mount Barker Council to review our Vegetation Management Plan, with specific focus on establishing plant species that are native to the area, identification and management of weeds and ongoing maintenance that reflects good fire management practices (slashing, fire breaks etc).

Research & Education Centre Construction Begins

This month, Stage 1 of construction for the new Research & Education Centre has commenced with the re-location of the laboratory to Adelaide and the refurbishment of the head office. It is anticipated that Stage 1 will be completed early in the new year.

Neutrog Divesting Langhorne Creek Property

Neutrog Australia has recently listed its Langhorne Creek property for sale.

Known as “The Station”, the approximately 500 acres of farming land, was purchased with the intention of undertaking R&D field trials and, subject to the relevant planning, regulations and licencing approvals, providing an alternative storage area for incoming material.

Since the purchase, field trials have been carried out by our R&D team, site surveying and earthworks were undertaken, all in conjunction with a share-farming program.

On review, the Board and management of Neutrog have determined that the time, resources, licencing and regulatory requirements involved in bringing the site to a position where it could accommodate incoming material, is such that it is no longer viable to pursue this direction.

The long-term operational viability of The Station was going to ultimately be dependent upon significant expansion of our production operations at Kanmantoo.

Hence, Neutrog are divesting the Langhorne Creek property and will now instead focus on its future expansion plans in Tamworth, where it has recently established operations.

The property sale will have no impact on Neutrog’s ongoing production and R&D operations, which will continue at Kanmantoo and Tamworth. Stage One construction work is also underway on the new Research and Education Centre development at Kanmantoo.

The field trials and share-farming at the Langhorne Creek site will continue until a sale agreement is executed

Neutrog will look to progress its carbon initiatives at other locations, where possible in the future.

In the context of growing global demand for our products, Neutrog remains focussed on continuing to explore all opportunities to improve our production process, along with working with our stakeholders and communities to grow business and jobs in the region.
